Each year, PEP will award one \$2,500 individual scholarship to students who meet the Scholarship Criteria and are enrolled in a two or four year college.



NEW THIS YEAR: Eligible degree courses of study include all Engineering fields, but preference will be given to environmental and natural science related degrees.

The Community Foundation will administer and select the recipients of the scholarships based on criteria established by the PEP Board of Directors.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria

A student who applies for a PEP scholarship for the sophomore, junior, senior and post graduate years:

- Must be an owner, employee or dependent of an owner or employee of the local branch/ site** of a company whose membership in Partners for Environmental Progress (PEP) is in good standing at the time of the application, selection and awarding of the scholarship to the applicant. **[Local branch/site is defined as limited to the following geographic areas, Mobile, Baldwin, Washington, and Clarke Counties in Alabama; Jackson County, Mississippi and Escambia County, Florida.]
- Must be currently enrolled at the time of the application, selection and awarding of the scholarship, as a full or part-time student in a two year or four year accredited technical college, or university for secondary or post-secondary work.
- Applicant must have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Applicant's declared course of study and major must be environmental science, environmental planning, environmental engineering, or other related science or engineering fields of study, including, but not limited to, marine science, geoscience, fisheries science, forestry, and estuarine science and management.
